The vision is of a world leading Agri-hub plus a leading distribution hub that will attract, retain and develop talent and businesses.

Te Utanganui is the road, rail and air hub that has hundreds of hectares of land, an expanding airport plus a ring-road and rail hub planned.

 The regions serviced by this hub contribute 22.4% of the country's GDP.

Using economic data provided by CEDA, several hotels are planned (one started this week) as well as central city apartment conversions, a possible hyper-data centre and large format warehousing. An example is Foodstuffs building 70,000m² storage (as big as 8 rugby fields)

Jerry forecasts that the region is in a strong position to double exports in 10 years.

CEDA has as its shareholders PN City and Manawatu Councils and works closely with iwi, business groups, Centreport and Port of Napier, Massey University etc.
