Guest: Sarah Parkinson, Road Safety Education/RYDA

Sue: the Memorial Trust has approved a grant of \$500 to Te Kura O Wairau so students are not missing an opportunity for them to play badminton.

Dennis: the Telecom building, first proposed in 1960 was finally completed in 1979. However, at the equivalent of 9 stories tall, progress in technology meant the equipment inside could have fitted in a double garage!

David E. news reported in the NY Times was the source of questions which, as they had a twist to them, resulted in us parting with \$71

Sarah: Rotary Youth Driver Awareness was started in 2001 in NSW after 4 teenagers died in a crash. This year in NZ 15,000 pupils will take part in the programme with 400 volunteers from 55 Rotary clubs assisting. There are corporate sponsors but it costs \$70/pupil so extra funds are required.

Sarah spent the day with 240 year 12 pupils at CET Arena and their day started with this this video. The 40 minute sessions then covered

- your personality (risk taker, easily distracted)
- road choices (speed restrictions, rumble strips, car and road star safety ratings),
- driver SOS so others survive (includes testing peripheral vision)
- speed & stopping with a Manfield diver traveling at speed and if you guess his stopping distance incorrectly he bowls over the "crash dummy"
- Crash investigations with Juliette. In 2005, after a crash on Railway Rd caused by her boyfriend, she was airlifted to Wellington, her life support initially turned off and spent the next 16 years rebuilding her life. After her sobering story the pupils had to identify the many ways the crash could have been prevented

Evaluations after similar courses show its message successfully staying with the participants!
