After our last meeting we received this email from Kahurangi:



Update

Rotary membership is not dead. Rotary Zone 8 reduced our membership decline by 42% over the previous year. Our largest net growth came from over 200 under 30 & 40 & 50 year old members joining our new style clubs. Last year saw 23 new clubs formed

"Please join in congratulating our 26,400 Rotary members, their families, club officers, community leaders, District Governors & Rotary staff members for inspiring our members to believe in Rotary & continue their membership to reduce member attrition."

Zone 8 is part of 2 ambitious global pilots of our Rotary International Board. The other is Great Britain & Ireland. Since July 2024 we experimented with a new support system for our clubs. Our 1185 Clubs grouped into 100 Rotary Community Groups to create bigger Impact. Each group elected their Rotary Community Leader. We elected a Regional Council as a Governance Body

reporting to the RI Board. Each Portfolio Director on the council set up a support team for Public Image, Membership, Learning, Programs, Partnerships, Projects, DEI & Community Leader Liaison. 80 specialists were made available online 24x7 to assist our clubs.

The Zone wide Membership Strategy resulted in 4 Teams activated, transforming existing clubs, new club creation, attracting alumni and sharing best practices to empower clubs to grow. For the 1st time in 5 years 49% of clubs reported growth or no loss of members. 11 of 18 districts recorded better growth than in 2023-24. Reducing member attrition by 20% & starting new style clubs were two of our key strategies. It has worked.

The team is happy with the results of our first year. Like all experiments the end result is not known. Follow us on Rotary South Pacific to learn our successes and failures as we enter the 2nd year of the pilot, so you can stand on our shoulders to see further than us.
