

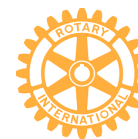

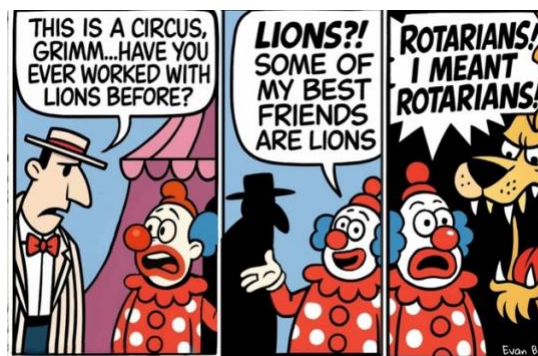
The Terrace End Memorial Education Trust News

- The Trust Board has received a request to help with the Takaro School camp for 70 year 5/6 students
- The Board is waiting to learn if the club's two applicants for the 2026 Science Forum are successful before finalising their applications for support
- The Board has made a grant towards the costs of 20 students travelling to the Tournament of Minds International Final in Sydney. TOM is an international problem-solving competition that challenges students to think creatively, work collaboratively and develop innovative solutions in the fields of STEM, the Arts, Social Sciences, and Language and Literature.

Their application said:

"This opportunity will allow students to compete on the world stage, developing critical thinking, teamwork, creativity and problem-solving skills, while building international connections and bringing pride to the Wairarapa community. This achievement reflects the students' hard work, dedication and teamwork and it is the first time such a large group from our region has advanced this far. Their involvement demonstrates a strong commitment to learning beyond the classroom and to developing skills that will benefit them in their future studies, careers and contributions to the community"
