– November 2024

As we enter November the rate of Wild Polio cases for this year continues to climb in Pakistan and Afghanistan, and while the numbers will not reach the 2020 totals, it is still a backward step for the last 3 years. This is not the time to give up, when Rotary started this fight to eradicate Polio there were a thousand new cases a day worldwide and we have come a long way from that point. We need to renew our efforts and support this programme to reach our goal. Although World Polio Day has come and gone we need to continue to inform the public that Polio is still affecting people and raise funds to eliminate this dreadful disease. *Two new Wild Polio paralysis cases reported this week. We are now 3 weeks since the most recent report of a child being paralyzed by the Wild Polio Virus in Pakistan.*
